Everyone was happy to participate and get stuck in to perform the correct 30 chest compressions to 2 breaths ratio on their mannequin, as well as practicing bandaging techniques and using an automatic defibrillator. We look forward to another strong term of short courses in term 3 with the Learners 3-day training and test, Hospitality cluster, and White Card all running.

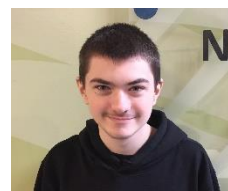

## White Card

To finish the term off the CLC ran a White Card short course for students looking to pursue a pathway in construction.

Topics such as duty of care, recognising hazards, accident regulations, penalties, and team behaviour were covered. This gave the students greater insight into the construction industry and how to stay safe on a work site.

Many students have expressed interest in enrolling into VET certifications as part of their SACE and education plan as well as working with their case managers to obtain work in construction industry.

## First Aid

This term the NEPSN CLC ran two First Aid short courses with almost 30 students gaining accreditation. Students worked through the legalities and obligations around first aid as well as sprains, fractures, bites, CPR, and much more.

With COVID – 19 still informing how many activities are facilitated students worked to perfect their bandaging techniques on pool noodles as a substitute for human limbs. Students were also careful to wipe down the Mannequins with disinfectant wipes after use, wear gloves and use hand sanitiser to ensure safe hygiene practices.

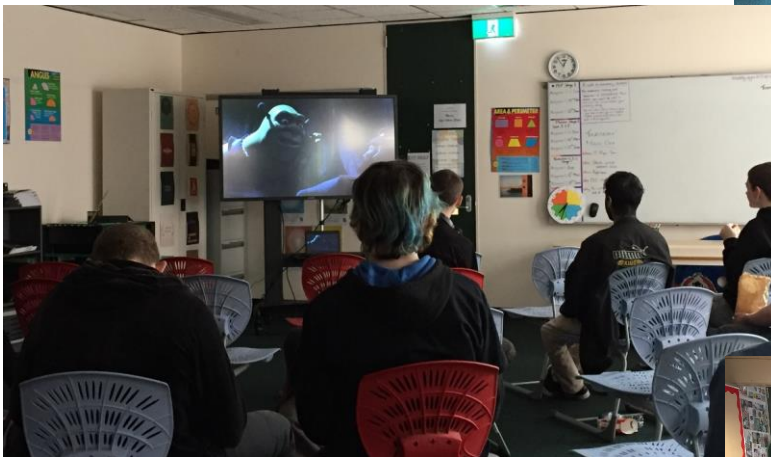
