Community Project

This semester, a group of students have been working with the Tea Tree Gully Council in a community project where they volunteer their time to help an organisation in need.

They planned and baked goods for a bake sale, where the goal was to raise money to help a Greyhound Adoption Program. Using the proceeds from the bake sale, students purchased the materials needed to create snuffle mats to donate to the Adoption Program. These snuffle mats are used to provide enrichment opportunities and stimulation for the dogs.

Students will also have the opportunity to use this learning to achieve SACE credits.

Stage 1 Integrated Learning: Conservation

During Term 3, students have been learning about wildlife conservation. They have looked at the five mass extinctions, megafauna and megaflora, and how the Earth has changed with the environment. They have completed an assignment to encourage people around the NESPN CLC to care for endangered Australian animals and learned about why people care more for certain species over others.

As part of the course, students went on an excursion to Gorge Wildlife Park where they experienced the animals up-close. They also undertook a guided tour through the park to prepare them for a group assignment where they will plan their own wildlife park. In this task students will need to work together to negotiate space and requirements for each animal to ensure their specific needs are met.

Stage 1 Integrated Learning: History


This term students have been investigating World War II with a focus on Nazi Germany. Using a variety of resources including historical articles and documentaries, students have been able to learn the details around the decline of the Weimar Republic and the subsequent rise of the Nazi Party. This has led to some fascinating class discussions on the topic.

From gaining a deeper understanding of these historical concepts and ideas, students have written a biography based on a Nazi figure including their early life, career and relationship to the Nazi Party.

Subsequently, students will learn how to accurately annotate a primary source used during World War II and work together as a team to complete and analysis of the source.
